

1 **TREVOR LAWRENCE** **QB** **CLEMSON**

6' 6"
220 lbs

From arm strength to anticipation to pocket presence, Lawrence has it all. The Clemson grad already reads the field like a 10-year NFL starter, executing passes with impeccable timing and velocity. As a first overall pick, Trev is as safe as they come.

2 **ZACH WILSON** **QB** **BYU**

6' 3"
210 lbs

I'm not saying he'll reach the same heights, but when Zach Wilson throws a ball it reminds me of Aaron Rodgers. He has special arm talent, allowing him to complete deep passes off-platform with ease. He's not yet the finished product, but Wilson's potential is frightening.

3 **PENEI SEWELL** **T** **OREGON**

6' 6"
325 lbs

The best offensive tackle in this class, Sewell dominated college football at only 19-years-old with his unique combination of power and movement skills. Considering his age, Sewell still has space for improvement, a scary prospect considering he didn't allow a single sack on nearly 1,000 snaps in 2019.

4 **JUSTIN FIELDS** **QB** **OHIO STATE**

6' 3"
228 lbs

Due to their lack of success at the pro level, Ohio State quarterbacks normally scare me. However, Fields has too much talent to let that prevent him from being considered an elite prospect in my eyes. His blend of accuracy, arm talent and running ability doesn't come around very often.

5 **JA'MARR CHASE** **WR** **LSU**

6' 1"
200 lbs

In 2019, at only 19-years-old, Ja'Marr Chase was absolutely unplayable. He's deceptively fast, has impeccable hands and plays even stronger than his size would suggest. To think he was the clear number one receiver on the LSU offence over Justin Jefferson shows just how talented Chase is.

6 **KYLE PITTS** **TE** **FLORIDA**

6' 6"
240 lbs

I wouldn't normally rank a tight end this highly, but Kyle Pitts is no normal tight end. At 6'6" and 240 lbs, Pitts ran a 4.44s 40-yard dash at his Pro Day, further solidifying his status as the ultimate matchup nightmare. If utilized correctly, he could be one of the best at the position.

7 **DEVONTA SMITH** **WR** **ALABAMA**

6' 1"
170 lbs

Smith's slight frame is causing him to plummet down many draft boards, but the weight doesn't bother me one bit. He plays much bigger than his size, consistently beating larger, stronger cornerbacks in press coverage. Smith creates separation better than anyone in this draft, and that's a valuable trait at any level.

8 **JAYLEN WADDLE** **WR** **ALABAMA**

5' 10"
182 lbs

The speedster of the receiver class, Waddle possesses outstanding burst and acceleration, as well wiggle and elusiveness. His injury history is slightly concerning, but when healthy, he strikes fear into the hearts of opposing secondaries.

9 **TREY LANCE** **QB** **NORTH DAKOTA STATE**

6' 4"
226 lbs

Probably the most physically gifted quarterback in the draft, Trey Lance is an aggressive thrower who loves attacking downfield with his monster arm. His tight end like build and toughness also make him a threat in the run game, particularly in short yardage situations.

10 **RASHAWN SLATER** **T** **NORTHWESTERN**

6' 3"
314 lbs

Slater allowed zero sacks and only five pressures on over 750 snaps during the 2019 season. Like many in this draft he opted out in 2020, but that shouldn't stop him from being taken near the top end of what is a very strong offensive tackle class.

11 **JEREMIAH OWUSU-KORAMOAH** **S/LB** **NOTRE DAME** **6' 2"**
215 lbs

Jeremiah Owusu-Koramoah is my favourite player to watch in this class and it's not even close. JOK hits as hard as any linebacker you'll see, but can also go toe-to-toe in coverage with receivers in the slot. He's the closest thing I've seen to Derwin James since Derwin James (and I really love Derwin James).

12 **MICAH PARSONS** **LB** **PENN STATE** **6' 3"**
240 lbs

One of the best defensive players in this draft class, Parsons has an aggressive mentality that pairs perfectly with his size and explosiveness. With elite run stopping ability and a handful of edge-rusher type moves that he shows off when blitzing, the Penn State linebacker is around the ball on every single play.

13 **PATRICK SURTAIN II** **CB** **ALABAMA** **6' 2"**
202 lbs

Surtain is as good as it gets when it comes to size, length and technique, and he used those tools to become the best cornerback in college football last year. If it wasn't for his lack of top-end speed, he'd most likely be a guaranteed top 10 pick in this draft.

14 **KWITY PAYE** **EDGE** **MICHIGAN** **6' 4"**
272 lbs

Despite a lack of sack production at the college level, the physical tools are just too freaky to ignore. Although certainly not the finished product, with the right coaching, it's difficult to see Kwity Paye not developing into an impact edge defender in the NFL.

15 **CALEB FARLEY** **CB** **VIRGINIA TECH** **6' 2"**
207 lbs

If you could erase his persistent back injuries, Farley would almost certainly be a top 10 prospect in this draft class. He possesses both the size and speed scouts look for in an elite cornerback, and backs up his traits with high-level production, allowing a passer rating of only 26.8 in the 2019 season.

16 **TREVON MOHRIG** **S** **TCU** **6' 2"**
202 lbs

Blessed with exceptional physical tools, Trevon Moehrig has been the one of the standout safeties in college football over the past two years. In both the 2019 and 2020 seasons he led all players at the position in pass breakups, frequently demonstrating his instincts and explosiveness.

17 **MAC JONES** **QB** **ALABAMA** **6' 3"**
214 lbs

In my opinion, Jones is the QB5 in this class, but that doesn't mean I don't believe he can be successful in the NFL. The National Championship winning quarterback was outstanding in 2020, boasting pin-point accuracy and impeccable timing. He's not the most tooly of guys, but he gets the ball where it needs to go.

18 **AZEEZ OJULARI** **EDGE** **GEORGIA** **6' 3"**
240 lbs

Ozulari is pure speed rusher who can threaten the edge against even the most athletic of tackles. Despite lacking some power, he plays hard in both the pass and run games, putting blockers on the back foot with his explosive first step.

19 **CHRISTIAN BARMORE** **DI** **ALABAMA** **6' 5"**
310 lbs

After starting the year slowly, Barmore turned it on when it mattered, wrecking the offensive lines of both Notre Dame and Ohio State on Alabama's run to the National Championship. The ideal build to rush the passer from the interior, he also possesses special flexibility for a player of his size.

20 **KADARIUS TONEY** **WR** **FLORIDA** **5' 11"**
193 lbs

Quite simply, Kadarius Toney is a playmaker. An explosive offensive weapon, Toney has speed, wiggle, burst and power, making him almost unstoppable after the catch. He's not the most polished route-runner you'll see, but get the ball in his hands and he'll take it to the house.

21 **JAYCEE HORN** **CB** **SOUTH CAROLINA** 6' 1"
205 lbs

Horn has both the athleticism and mindset to thrive as a man coverage corner in the NFL – he won't back down from anyone. The South Carolina defensive back allowed only eight catches and 116 yards in the seven games he played last year, an impressive statistic.

22 **RASHOD BATEMAN** **WR** **MINNESOTA** 6' 1"
200 lbs

One of the best route runners in college football, Bateman can beat cornerbacks immediately off the line of scrimmage with either his size or his shake. Although he lacks top speed, the Minnesota wideout looks ready to be a true 'X' receiver at the next level.

23 **CHRISTIAN DARRISAW** **T** **VIRGINIA TECH** 6' 5"
314 lbs

A certified people-mover, Darrisaw broke out in 2020 and quickly became one of the best Power 5 tackles in the country. He has tremendous strength in his upper-body and possesses a pair of truly powerful hands that regularly stop rushers in their tracks.

24 **NICK BOLTON** **LB** **MISSOURI** 6' 0"
232 lbs

Nick Bolton is the kind of guy you want in the middle of your defence. Although he's not the biggest, fastest or strongest linebacker in this class, he makes big plays more frequently than anyone else, leading the SEC in defensive stops in each of the past two seasons.

25 **JAELEN PHILLIPS** **EDGE** **MIAMI** 6' 5"
266 lbs

A star of the 2020 college football season, Jaelan Phillips has physical tools in abundance and projects well to becoming a top tier NFL edge defender. However his injury history is highly concerning, as repeated concussions led him to briefly retire from the game back in 2018.

26 **JASON OWEH** **EDGE** **PENN STATE** 6' 5"
252 lbs

Despite not picking up a single sack in his final year at Penn State, Oweh is a defensive line coach's dream. A physical freak of nature, if taught better technique on pass-rush moves, he could become an absolute monster in the NFL.

27 **TEVEN JENKINS** **T** **OKLAHOMA STATE** 6' 6"
320 lbs

Teven Jenkins likes to put defenders in the turf and he does so on a regular basis. An absolute mauler in the run game, he improved his pass blocking tremendously last year, allowing only 4 pressures in 7 games.

28 **ELIJAH MOORE** **WR** **MISSISSIPPI** 5' 9"
185 lbs

An elite all-round athlete, Moore can run an accomplished route-tree from the slot with a high-level of execution. He was one of the highest-graded receivers in college football last season, hauling in 1,193 yards in only 8 games.

29 **ALIJAH VERA-TUCKER** **T/G** **USC** 6' 4"
315 lbs

Although likely to kick back into guard at the pro-level, Vera-Tucker was a top tier tackle for USC in 2020. One of the cleanest offensive lineman prospects in the class, he has fantastic ability to play in space.

30 **ASANTE SAMUEL JR.** **CB** **FLORIDA STATE** 5' 10"
184 lbs

It might sound like lazy analysis to say that Asante plays just like his dad, but he really does! Although not the biggest or fastest, Samuel Jr. is a super smooth athlete with incredible instincts and feel for the position.

31 **ZAVEN COLLINS** **LB** **TULSA** **6'5"**
260 lbs

Despite being 6'5" and 260lbs, Collins moves with the fluidity and burst of a more undersized linebacker. His combination of old school size and modern athleticism, as well as superb coverage ability, makes him a highly enticing prospect.

32 **RONDALE MOORE** **WR** **PURDUE** **5'9"**
180 lbs

When it comes to breaking tackles, you won't find many better. A sneaky good route-runner from the slot, Moore is electrifying with the ball in his hands and surprisingly strong for his size.

33 **DILLON RADUNZ** **T** **NORTH DAKOTA STATE** **6'6"**
299 lbs

An offensive tackle with mauler mentality, Radunz explodes off the line of scrimmage and gets hands on defenders immediately. He wasn't asked to pass-block too often in the North Dakota State offence, but that doesn't mean he can't.

34 **TERRACE MARSHALL JR.** **WR** **LSU** **6'3"**
200 lbs

At only 20-years-old, Marshall has a huge catch radius and legit speed. He can be slightly dominated physically due to his slight frame, but that shouldn't prevent him from being a productive NFL receiver.

35 **SAMUEL COSMI** **T** **TEXAS** **6'6"**
314 lbs

Cosmi is an absolute mountain of a man who ran a 4.85 second 40-yard dash at his pro day. One of the most tested tackles in college football, he also improved in each of his three seasons at Texas, allowing only 8 pressures last year.

36 **GREGORY ROUSSEAU** **EDGE** **MIAMI** **6'6"**
260 lbs

In terms of tools, Gregory Rousseau has the making of a top-ten selection, however his lack of play time is a concern. As he opted out of the 2020 season, Rousseau enters the draft with only 546 snaps over his entire college career. That being said, he did rack up 15.5 sacks in 2019.

37 **NAJEE HARRIS** **RB** **ALABAMA** **6'2"**
230 lbs

Although it's close with Travis Etienne, I believe Najee Harris to be the best running back prospect in this class. A similar style player to Matt Forte, he isn't just a power back at 6'2" and 230lbs, he has exceptional ball skills and elusiveness as well. Harris has workhorse RB written all over him.

38 **GREG NEWSOME II** **CB** **NORTHWESTERN** **6'1"**
190 lbs

Newsome's numbers in coverage last year were outstanding, allowing just 12 catches and 93 yards on 34 targets over the course of the six-game season. Despite the production, a lack of acceleration and speed is a worry.

39 **ALEX LEATHERWOOD** **T/G** **ALABAMA** **6'6"**
312 lbs

Leatherwood is a dominant run-blocker, maybe the best in the draft, but his deficiencies in the pass game will likely prevent him from being a first round pick.

40 **TRAVIS ETIENNE** **RB** **CLEMSON** **5'10"**
205 lbs

Etienne is as impressive as a receiver as he is a runner, making him ideal for the modern NFL offence that demands both traits from a running back.

41 **LANDON DICKERSON** **C** **ALABAMA** **6' 6"**
325 lbs

When it comes to on-field production, Dickerson is one of the best centre prospects we've seen in a few years. A torn ACL in the SEC title game and a troubling injury history might scare teams off though.

42 **WYATT DAVIS** **G** **OHIO STATE** **6' 4"**
315 lbs

Davis dipped in 2020 after an outstanding 2019 seasons, but has still given up only 4 sacks and hits combined over the past two years.

43 **CARLOS BASHAM JR.** **EDGE** **WAKE FOREST** **6' 5"**
285 lbs

A physically imposing edge defender, Basham collected 112 pressures across 2018 and 2019 before having a down year in 2020.

44 **PAT FREIERMUTH** **TE** **PENN STATE** **6' 5"**
258 lbs

Occasionally referred to as 'Baby Gronk' (an overly flattering nickname in my opinion), Freiermuth is a tight end that dominates the middle of the field with his size and ball skills.

45 **WALKER LITTLE** **T** **STANFORD** **6' 7"**
309 lbs

Little is one of the more interesting prospects in this draft. His physical tools are highly desirable, but he's only played one game since 2018 due to injury and the pandemic.

46 **JABRIL COX** **LB** **LSU** **6' 4"**
231 lbs

If you're looking for a linebacker who can cover than Jabril Cox is your guy. He was the only player at the position to break up multiple passes in the one-on-ones at the Senior Bowl, mirroring his on field play at LSU.

47 **JACKSON CARMAN** **T/G** **CLEMSON** **6' 5"**
335 lbs

Although not the most consistent, Carman has brilliant hand usage and is surprisingly supple for his size. He also put up some very good tape against Ohio State, a game fresh in evaluators' minds.

48 **LIAM EICHENBERG** **T** **NOTRE DAME** **6' 6"**
302 lbs

Eichenberg is an incredibly clean offensive tackle who has produced highly impressive stats over the past two seasons, not allowing a single sack and surrendering only 27 total pressures.

49 **JAMAR JOHNSON** **S** **INDIANA** **6' 1"**
197 lbs

A graceful athlete with ridiculous hip-flip and quiet feet, Johnson reminds me of Malik Hooker coming out. However, tackling has been a big problem for the Indiana safety, missing 18 of 80 attempts in his career.

50 **KYLE TRASK** **QB** **FLORIDA** **6' 5"**
240 lbs

Outside of the consensus top five quarterbacks, Trask is the only other QB that I see with NFL starter potential. He was one of the best players in college football in 2020, getting the nod as one of the four Heisman Trophy finalists alongside Trevor Lawrence, Devonta Smith and Mac Jones.
